Manuscript Processing Procedure

- I. The Journal is interested in publishing papers in English of total length not exceeding 9600 words which focus on timely and important issues concerning economics, management, language, physical education, medicine, art and other academic fields. Papers concerning Macao will be given priority in publication.
- II. Manuscripts should not have been published or accepted for publication elsewhere. Submission of an article implies that the work described has not been published previously (except in the form of an abstract or as part of a published lecture or academic thesis), that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, that its publication is approved by all authors and tacitly or explicitly by the responsible authorities where the work was carried out, and that, if accepted, it will not be published elsewhere in the same form, in English or in any other language, without the written consent of the Publisher.
- III. Manuscripts will be reviewed by the editorial board or specialists who are knowledgeable in the subject area addressed.
- IV. The editorial board is empowered to request revisions and modifications of the submitted manuscripts.

Manuscript Style

I. *Title Page and Abstract Page*

The title of the manuscript, the author's name, title, institutional affiliation. The abstract page should include the title, an abstract of length not exceeding 150 words, including a maximum of six keywords.

II. *Text*

1. Main and subheadings should be used. They should flush left, in upper and lower case, primary headings in bold and secondary headings in bold and italics. The first line of each paragraph should be indented and the text single-spaced.
2. Reference citations within the text should consist of the cited author's last name and the year of publication, enclosed in parentheses and with a comma, for example (Cragin, 1985). If the author's name appears in the sentence, only the year of publication should appear in parentheses, for example, 'as discussed by Chow and Blumenfeld (1984)'.
References to multiple works should occur within one set of parentheses, separated by semicolon, for example, (Doktor, Redding & Bidgood, 1985; Farmer & Chan, 1983; Tai, 1984).

III. Endnotes

In the text, place a superscript numeral immediately after the text about which you would like to include more information. Number the notes consecutively in the order they appear in your paper. At the end of the paper, create a separate section labeled Notes.

IV. Tables and Figures

Each table/figure should be numbered consecutively in Arabic numerals. The title should be in upper and lower case and centered.

V. References

References are listed in alphabetical order by first author's last name. Multiple papers by the same author should be listed in chronological order. Examples below may serve as guides:
